### **Wreningham Fuel Trust**

The Trust Deed sets out that "The income from Wreningham Fuel Trust has to be given to provide fuel for the poor persons of the parish of Wreningham". This means that the charity income is available to anybody living in the parish who is in need and the application may be made by the needy person or anybody who wishes to nominate a person to receive help towards their fuel bills. All applications are treated as confidential and only the clerk and Trustees are aware of the people considered for help.

Please feel free to apply if you or somebody you know are struggling to cover the cost of heating as we go into the winter. The next Trustees meeting is on Tuesday 21st November, when we will consider any applications received. After that you do not have to wait for a given date when the Trustees meet. The clerk can deal with any applications when they come in and you should have an answer within weeks of applying. Our 8<sup>th</sup> September meeting took the form of an interactive session with our visitors reacting to videos and stories about the village trotting track at The Poplars in the 1980s & 90s. Impressive colour video recordings from the time showed these trotting races to be very professionally operated: the jockeys wore silks, there were race stewards, a live commentary for each race - and betting, too! We also looked at (the once lost) texts from the BBC's mid 1980s Domesday project. Not only did the meeting prove enjoyable but it also produced a record turn-out - from Wreningham and two other villages. We learnt more than we expected from our "audience" who happily described their own memories from the period.
