### OFFICIAL OPENING



## KITCHEN CAPERS

As we are having such a lovely summer I thought it would be a good idea to suggest two rather tasty vegetable dishes which go very well with grills or barbecued food.

Cut small (3-4 inches long) courgettes into half lengthwise and scrape out middles with a teaspoon. Mix scooped out middles with breadcrumbs, skinned and de-seeded tomatoes, crushed garlic or chopped, fried onion, salt and pepper and pile back into courgette halves. Top with pieces of butter or margarine and bake in medium oven till the tops are browned and the courgettes soft - about 30-40 minutes.

## Celery provencale

1 head celery

1 large onion

1 clove garlic (optional)

4 large tomatoes

2 oz. margarine

tsp. mixed dried herbs
level tsp. tomato puree
salt and pepper

Clean and cut celery into 1" lengths. Simmer in salted water for 6-8 minutes till tender. Strain.

Melt margarine in pan and add thinly sliced onions, crushed garlic, herbs and salt and pepper and cook 2-3 minutes until tender.

Add skinned chopped tomatoes and puree.

Bring to boil and cook over low heat for 4-5 minutes.

Stir in celery and heat through.

## Painting over old tiles



When old wall tiles start to look faded and really down at heel, it is possible to paint over them. Wash them thoroughly, paying special attention to the grouting between the tiles. When they are dry, rub them with a medium grade emery cloth to dull the glaze. Dust them off and wipe them with a rag soaked in methylated spirits. As soon as this evaporates apply a coat of a good quality lacquer, such as Valspar or Carson's lacquer. Further coats can be applied as needed to get a good gloss.

The Mardle has been asked by the Parish Council to publish the following item -

## "The Rectory Field

Following the enquiry kindly organised by members of the village hall committee, resulting in a substantial return and an indication that in excess of 85% were in favour of the Rectory Field being purchased and thereby available for outdoor sports and activities as in the past, for all time, the Parish Council have decided to undertake the purchase providing that:- (a) the necessary finance is forthcoming and (b) a Management Committee operating independently under a Trust Deed can be formed.

The purchase price is £5,000 plus Legal Fees, estimated at £250. This figure has been qualified by the District Valuer as fair and reasonable - he further stated informally that in his opinion, in view of the nearness of the new village hall, this was an unique opportunity which should not be passed by and would make a very important contribution in the future in providing permanent facilities of a nature unlikely again to be available.

The 'Financial' situation to date is as follows:-

Immediate sum needed

€5,250

The South Norfolk District Council have offered a grant of one-third - £1,750 which leaves a balance of £3,500 to be funded locally.

- Any items concerning use, etc. you would like written into the Trust Deed
- 4. Any other items you would like considered.

Offers to run and/or assist in money raising activities have also already been made and other will gratefully be made use of by the Management Committee in due time. It is envisaged that the project will be run side by side with the village hall and the two will be complementary to each other. The project has the support of the Norfolk Playing Fields Association who are being very helpful and encouraging.

Would individuals who are prepared to serve on the Management Committee please also give their names to one of the undersigned. It is anticipated that the Committee of Management will include representatives of the Parish Council, the Village Hall Committee, and all interested organised bodies, together with independently elected members.
