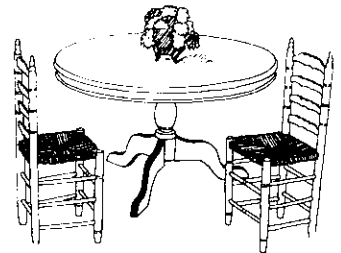

## Kitchen Capers

A quick, easy and tasty dish for the cooler summer days.

### Escalopes of Chicken cordon bleu

4 boned and skinned chicken breasts (M&S have good ones)  
4 slices ham  
4-6 ozs button mushrooms  
4 slices cheese (Edam or Gruyere)  
Salt & pepper  
Flour  
Chicken stock (cube will do)  
2 ozs butter



Method Slice mushrooms and cook in butter for a few minutes. Remove from pan and brown joints in remaining butter, top up if necessary. Remove joints and make sauce by adding flour and cooking for a few minutes before adding stock till sauce is ready. Add seasoning and check. Put chicken joints in casserole, ham slices on top followed by cheese and mushrooms. Pour sauce round and cook in covered casserole for 30 - 40 minutes in a covered casserole. (Moderate oven). Serve sprinkled with chopped parsley and colourful vegetables with new potatoes.
