Cooke

This a very useful sweet which for size Summ and can be made with a variety of fillings.

Zwetschen Kvich 26. German plum cake)

Base

4 oz. plain flour

3 oz. butter (or margarine)

1 oz. caster sugar

Plums - or blackberries, rhubarb, apple, apricots, raspberries, blackcurrants. etc. etc. with chopped nuts or spices with apples

Topping

3 oz. caster sugar

3 eggs

3 oz. S.R. flour

Method

Grease swiss roll tin and line with greased paper.

Make base by rubbing butter into flour and mixing in caster sugar. Tip into lined tin and press down, sprinke with chopped nuts if used.

Put stoned plums onto base and sprinkle with sugar.

Make sponge by whisking together eggs and sugar till creamy then folding in flour gently with metal spoon.

Pour sponge mixture onto fruit and tip to spread evenly to corners. Bake in middle of oven (350°) for approximately 45 minutes.

Serve dusted with icing sugar and with whipped cream - either cold or warm.

To freeze - freeze in tin and turn out when frozen solid. To serve - cut up while still semi-frozen. PB
