

# VILLAGE HALL EXTENSION - SPECIAL MEETING - 24 APRIL 1992

After more than 3 years of fund raising the Village Hall Management Committee have accumulated sufficient funds, including a generous legacy, to proceed with the building of the planned extension to the village hall. In order to progress the project the committee have been discussing details with the Parish Council with the object of the scheme being undertaken as a joint venture. In this way the V.A.T. which would normally be payable could be reclaimed - this would amount to a saving in excess of £5,000 which would involve probably a further 2 years fund raising.


The Parish Council have indicated that they would be willing to enter into this partnership arrangement and support the scheme if they were sure that the local residents of Wreningham also wish to see the extension built.

The proposed extension which has already received planning permission will extend across the rear of the hall. It will contain a lounge area with a new bar, chair store, additional toilets including facilities for the disabled - all with an access from the Car Park as well as from the main hall itself. By relocating the bar there will be the opportunity to enlarge the kitchen to meet the new food handing regulations which have been the subject of recent publicity. It is envisaged that the new lounge and bar area would be carpeted and furnished with comfortable chairs to make the surroundings more inviting. Plans of the extension will be displayed at the meeting and any questions you may have answered.

Do please try to come - this is your Village Hall and the scheme has been designed to improve what is already a valubale community facility.
