VILLAGE HALL EXTENSION

At their recent meeting the Parish Council voted to accept the lowest tender for the new extension. Along with the Village Hall Managment Committee they were very pleased that the successful builder was S.V.Harvey & Son from the village - local job - local firm - local employees.

Since that meeting South Norfolk District Council have considered and approved the application for grant aid of approximately £20,000 towards the cost of the extension and renewing the heating system in the existing hall. An application to the licensing magistrates is due to be considered in the middle of October after which work can start on the extension once a programme of work has been agreed with the builder. That only leaves the grand opening party to be arranged!!
