

KEEP FIT - Don't forget Keep Fit sessions at the village hall on Wednesday evenings at 8.15 p.m. £2.00.


WRENINGHAM SOCIAL CLUB

Health services and our own health needs are constantly changing. Healthlink is a new service, set up in April 1992 as part of the Patient's Charter, to be a point of contact for the public of East Anglia.

We can provide information on local and regional health services including where specialist treatments are based. We can help to find the shortest waiting times, and give information on conditions, diseases and treatments. We can also tell you about local and national self-help groups, give health promotion information and advise on how to complain if things go wrong in the NHS. Our services are provided in the strictest confidence.

Now that spring is on the way and you are all starting cleaning how about these tips.

Windows - Old newspapers, slightly dampened is great for cleaning windows. Use dry newspapers for the final polish.

Copper - A slice of lemon dipped in salt brings copper up as bright as new.

Furniture - To remove old wax and dirt from wood furniture use a mixture of vinigar and warm water.

Drawers - Rub a candle along the bottom of the draw to avoid it sticking or squeaking.

Refrigerator - Use a teaspoonful of bicarbonate of soda in warm water to wash out your refrigerator. It will get rid of that musty smell.
