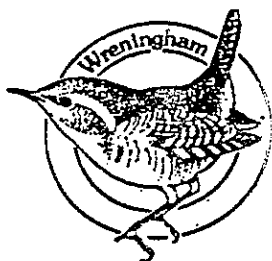

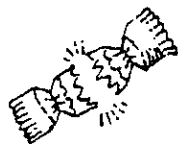

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

During the autumn a certain amount of vandalism has occurred. The recently repaired notice board was smashed. Panes of glass in the telephone kiosk at Top Row were broken. A car had its window broken in the village hall car park as well as continued acts of vandalism on the playing field notably the children's play area. This is a worrying trend, made all the more so as the council still feels that the culprits are from the village.

The cost of repairing damage around the village eventually comes from your council tax. So please, be vigilant and report any strange disturbances to either the council, your local homework representative or the Wymondham police.

With winter upon us, now is the time to check that any drains or ditches that you are responsible for are clear and running freely, and so prevent the scenes of last year's flooding. The highway authority has included in its budget for the coming year a small scheme to alleviate the drainage problem on the upper part of Church Road. Let's hope this is instigated sooner rather than later.

Should the need arise, South Norfolk Council has a policy of providing up to 20 unfilled sandbags to each household, free of charge, and will deliver filled sandbags to those in dire need in emergencies. Please contact their Emergency Planning Team on 0508 5336060 for further details.
