#### Tree Warden Scheme: Ian Dobson

The Parish Council has appointed me as the Tree Warden for Wreningham and a notice will shortly appear on the board by the village sign.

The Tree Warden Scheme is a national initiative to enable people to play an active role in conserving and enhancing their local trees and woods. Tree Wardens are volunteers, appointed by parish councils, who gather information about their local trees, get involved in local tree matters and encourage local practical projects associated with trees and woods. The scheme was launched in 1990 and by 1997 there were over 6000 Tree Wardens.

How the Scheme Works - Tree Wardens work closely with their local community, local farmers and landowners. Among the tasks they become involved in are: gathering information and doing surveys of their local trees, so as to develop ideas for projects, discover where practical help and advice is needed and become aware of threats to trees. Tree Wardens may be asked questions on what species to plant, how to deal with a damaged tree and how to obtain grant aid for planting. I will not necessarily have all the answers but I will soon learn where to find them!

Community involvement is one of the main aims of the scheme and I would welcome any contribution to the current project, you may have heard about it on local TV, the "Veteran Tree Project". The UK has the greatest number of veteran trees in Northern Europe and we aim to locate them all. I think that Wreningham has very few, what there are most likely to be Oak and have a girth in excess of 4m. If you know of any "ancient" looking trees in your vicinity please let me know. If you have any suggestions or project ideas I welcome your contribution.
