

MILLENIUM PROJECT

After consideration of options, prices and comments from villagers about the turret clock, the committee has settled on an electrically driven movement, hopefully with 2 faces of gold plate figures on a blue background. To keep the cost down it will not at this stage have a striking mechanism. Most of the work has been offered on a voluntary basis which means that the total cost will be about £5,500.00.

The Good news is that we have to date almost £3,000 worth of donations - well done for coming forward so quickly. If you have not yet made a donation remember that a list of donors (without a record of amounts given) will be displayed for permanent record in the church.

The village school has recently done a sponsored "Tell the Time" - the sum raised is not yet finalised but well done to them.

Two of the committee will be doing a sponsored Tandem ride on 10th/11th July. Please sponsor them. We have been offered a flight in a small aircraft and the first raffle of a pair of tickets will take place at the Funday on 27th June. It is hoped to have an Art Exhibition in September when the Church has their Flower Festival and a further pair of tickets for a flight may be raffled then. There is also talk of a car boot sale in the autumn.

With your very generous donations and anticipated support for these fund raising events - we should be well on target to have the clock in place by mid-night 31.12.99
