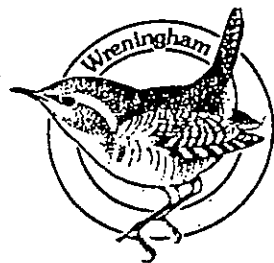

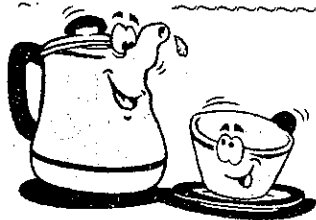

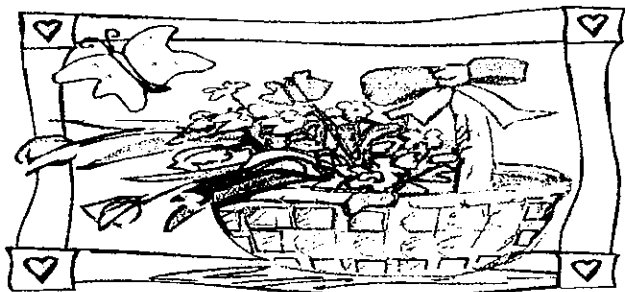

## WRENINGHAM "ALL SAINTS" CHURCH

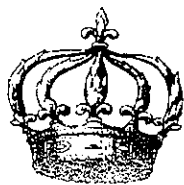
