#### **Housing Needs Survey**

With rocketing house prices the odds are becoming increasingly stacked against members of our community securing affordable, appropriate housing in the areas that they want to live.

Many wish to remain living in the areas in which they grew up, in contact with networks of family and friends but are often forced to move to the nearest town or city. Few join housing waiting lists due to the limited stock of council or social housing in their village, and some are forced to remain in the family home longer and find it difficult to make the step to independent living.

Wreningham Parish Council in conjunction with the Norfolk Rural Community Council wishes to discover and potential housing requirements within the parish and is concerned that there may be a lack of appropriate housing for local people.

With the next edition of the Mardle you will find a Housing Needs Survey that aims to find out whether there is a requirement for a small housing project within the village. Whether you consider yourself to be in housing need or not, the information that you will provide by completing the survey is extremely important to us.

If need for affordable housing is identified, a small amount of affordable homes could be provided by a Housing Association, with properties offered for rent or shared ownership, to help to house **local** people. Please bear in mind that it may take some time for these homes to be completed.

Melissa Adcock, Rural Housing Enabler will open the responses and analyse them, and will prepare independent feedback for the Parish council. All information that you provide will be treated in the strictest confidence.

Friends and family who would like to live in the village can also complete the questionnaire. They must have strong connections with the village to be considered. Extra forms can be obtained from Norfolk Rural Community Council Tel No: 01362 698216.

#### Refuse and Recycling Collection

A video—"Think Twice" refuse and recycling has been introduced by South Norfolk District Council to make South Norfolk residents more aware about the new arrangements for collecting waste. The new kerbside scheme has proved very successful in other parts of the district and they are aiming to cover the whole district by 2005/06. Some parts of Wreningham are already covered by the new scheme, however no set date has been given as to when they are covering the entire Wreningham area.

#### Wreningham Playing Field Project

The project to establish new play facilities for youngsters on the village field is now well underway and our fundraising target of £20,500 is within reach.

The project was initiated over parish council concerns about both the lack of facilities for youngsters in the village and an awareness of the dangers for youngsters in riding skateboards and scooters around the crossroads area of the village.

A project management team has drawn up plans for a small skateboard area, basketball net and youth shelter on the village playing field after a survey of village youngsters.

We see this project as important to the future of the community within Wreningham. It is intended to make the village more attractive to youngsters and their families and give them something to do within the village itself.

The project has already attracted support from the youth club, school, village hall committee, village children and residents who have all contributed towards the project through discos, a talent show and the open gardens event. The parish council has provided the site.

Major grants have been given by South Norfolk Council and Waste Recycling Environmental Ltd (WREN). Smaller amounts have been received from Archant, Virgin and also from many generous village residents.

### BMX track proposal

Once work begins on the Playing Field Project, a quantity of top soil will be removed from the site and it has been suggested that it could be used along one edge of the playing field to create a couple of small humps for use with BMX/Mountain bikes.
