RURAL PROJECTS FUND GRANTS SCHEME

GRANTS OF UP TO £1500 AVAILABLE FOR SMALL COMMUNITY PROJECTS IN YOUR AREA

Norfolk Rural Community Council has revised its Rural Projects Fund. Grants are now available for a maximum of £1500 to cover up to 75% of total project costs.

Applications are welcome from community and voluntary groups whose projects benefit their local community. Groups need to demonstrate that local consultation has taken place and 25% Match Funding is required.

Types of projects that the fund has supported are:

- Play Areas and Play Equipment
- Leaflets to promote local walks
- Information Boards and Signs for Wildlife and Recreational Areas
- Village Notice Boards
- Village Signs
- Creating and improving Wildlife Areas
- Bus Shelters
- Information/Welcome packs for newcomers to the village
- Art Exhibitions and Family History Groups
