The village hall management committee realises that not everybody has access to the internet, so as soon as we have any real information we will be putting a large notice board up in the Margaret Preston room, which is open every Thursday and Friday evening from 8 pm for Social Club, and you would be welcome to call in and look at the details.

The management committee has submitted an application form for a grant to install a renewable energy system and will probably be considering solar panels and/or a 15 meter high wind turbine on the car park. If we are successful in our application we shall be displaying details of the options (also in the Margaret Preston room) and seeking the views of parishioners.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Tuesday 21st July in the Margaret Preston room at 7.30 pm.

Anglian Water have asked that we let our residents know the following:

”Please can you advise local residents that due to the work to be undertaken and the narrowness of the roads there will be considerable disruption within the village whilst the work is underway. If this causes problems and particularly anyone running a business then they must contact the site office (in mill lane when the work starts) to see what can be done to help the situation and let Sarah Hill know too.

Anglian water will not countenance any claims for business interruption etc. if they have not been informed of the problem at the time and not had a chance to rectify any access problems. People will be able to get in and out of their properties at the beginning and end of each day and if needed during the day for appointments (i.e. hospital etc) but they must let the guys working on site know in advance. When Top Row is closed people will have to make alternative arrangements for parking their cars during the day.

Those residents who are having a pot in their land will receive a 7 day notice towards the end of the month. On each notice there will be a revised road closure date. However, anyone who is not to have a pot on their land will not receive any form of notice from Anglian Water.

Please can residents check the website - wreningham.org for up to date information. In the site there is a facility for you to receive any updates via email. Please check to keep yourselves up to date. The road closures will also go on the notice boards

Making a connection to the new Public Sewer – This is an advance notice from CNC Building control and further information will follow.

You will need to submit a Building Regulation application to South Norfolk Council to cover the work required to alter your existing drainage system and connect to the pipe Anglia Water will be laying from the new sewer to your property. Without express permission from Anglia Water no connection can be made to the new sewer until it has been completed and commissioned. As this is some months away there is no need to rush to make an application. You would also be advised not to undertake any work in preparation for the connections until the exact levels of the lateral connection on your properties are known/in place.

In most cases the work involved is very straight forward and does not warrant the preparation of detailed plans and specifications. Provided you have a competent person doing the work a Building Notice application is all that will be required. Application forms and explanatory leaflets can be downloaded from CNC's website * www.cncbuildingcontrol.gov.uk .

Every effort will be made to make the process as simple as possible, including additional detailed advice and a question and answer section on CNC's website closer to the date.

An application will need to be submitted before work commences and CNC Building Control will need to be informed when the drains are laid to allow an inspection to be undertaken before the drains are backfilled. The inspection will check to ensure that the drains are laid to a fall and have adequate provision for cleaning.

An additional inspection will also need to be undertaken when the works are complete, at which time the new drains should be placed on test for the surveyor to witness. If everything is in order a completion certificate will be issued.

When an application is made you will need a completed form, the appropriate fee and a site plan. The plan Anglia Water produce will be sufficient as long as you indicate on the plan, roughly where the drains and any associated manholes will be positioned. Everything else will be dealt with on site. If you or your contractors are unsure of any aspect of the work talk direct to one of the surveyors to avoid abortive work.

The submission process and inspections are not drawn out affairs. As soon as you have submitted the application you can commence work, although it would be beneficial if the application could be submitted at least two weeks before you intend to start work to allow the application to be registered. When works commence, provided you contact CNC before 10.00am, an inspection will be made the same day to avoid holding up your contractor.
