REFURBISHED BUS STOP

The Bus Stop on the B1113 near Top Row was quite neglected and run down with ivy overgrowing the roof and walls, the woodwork rotting and falling off, the internal roof collapsing, hedging growing around and over the walls, grass overgrowing the hard standing area and rubbish strewn over the floor inside. The Parish Council has addressed this with the help of:

- Parish Councillors, who removed the rubbish and part cleared the frontage
- NCC Highway Rangers, in one of their regular visits to the village, undertook removal of the heavy overgrowth of ivy
- J Moon Improvements, who undertook the bulk of the repair work to the roof and ceiling, and
- Travis Perkins on Mill Lane, who kindly donated the materials for this work free of charge.

The Autumn term has been busy! The school was delighted to be awarded its third International Green Flag award for its environmental work with the pupils - one of only three schools in Norfolk to be awarded it for a third consecutive time.

For the Harvest Festival, the school is doing a 90kg Rice challenge - we have bought 90kg of Fairtrade rice to sell to parents - if we succeed in selling all the rice at the Fairtrade price, we will have sed enough money to send a Malawian farmer's son or daughter to a school for one year - helping them escape from grinding poverty.

We had a puppet theatre in school performing Monster in My Piano! The children really enjoyed the performance. The School Council have organised a 'Career Day' in which children dress in the uniform of a future career they aspire to! The school is performing Christmas plays – Key Stage 1 and the Foundation Stage 11th Nativity (Hey – Ewe!) 13th and 14th (9.15) December and Key Stage 2 11th (6pm) and 12th (9.15) in the village hall. The Friends of Wreningham Primary School have been very busy fund raising – they have had a cake stall and non-uniform day this term. All-in-all a very busy term!

Mr George William Ireland

Mr George Ireland died on 6th November aged 92 years, probably at the time the oldest resident of the village.

After serving in the Second World War he married Mabel in 1947 and moved into Beech Tree Cottage, Top Row, and worked at The Grange until his retirement. Throughout his time in Wreningham he has been involved in supporting the village. In the early days he was secretary of the fete committee helping to organise an annual event at The Grange. Elected to the Parish Council in about 1957 he served for 40 years and was their appointed Trustee on the Fuel Trust for 52 years from 1958. He was a school governor for a time. In his younger days he played in the village football and cricket teams and later became a football linesman and a cricket umpire. He retired from public duty in 2009 but active to the very end he still drove his car and regularly attended the last Wednesday coffee mornings.

Well done George! A truly remarkable record of support for Wreningham.
