COMMUNITY RECYCLING IN WRENINGHAM

(extracts from an article by Norfolk County Council)

Recycling is important today because we are running out of landfill space, it is getting more expensive to throw away and we are facing tough waste targets set by the European Union and government.

Wreningham has some excellent facilities for waste reduction. A glass bank is available at the village hall, about four swap shops are held each year (Free sales – see flyer) to help get rid of those unwanted items and exchange for something useful.

The village has a Master Composter volunteer to provide information and support. The School organises Bags 2 School collections. This is a great start but there are many small and easy steps that we can undertake to “slim our bin” so why not have a go?

A third of our food is thrown away. Use leftovers (recipes on www.lovefoodhatewaste.com) Manage portions sizes. Use your freezer. Use a shopping list and stick to it. Make waste free packed meals.

Smart Shopping - choose items with little or no packaging, buy fruit and vegetables loose, buy in bulk, buy refills

Junk Mail - For addressed junk mail contact Mail preference Service 08457 034599. Opt out of the public copy of the electoral register. Write “return to sender” on unwanted mail and post it back. Put a “No junk mail please” sticker on your letterbox.

Reuse - Use envelopes with reuse labels. Reuse plastic bags or use bags for life. Donate items to charity shops. Sell items through Ebay, local adverts, at car boot sales. Pass on items via internet sites such as Freegle (www.norfolk-freegle.org.uk).

Recycle - as much as you can at home through your recycling bin. Get composting and use the compost bin for fruit and veg peelings and garden waste. A huge range of materials can be recycled at your local Main Recycling Centre at Station Lane, Ketteringham or Strayground Lane, Wymondham.
