Top Row/Mill Lane/B1113 crossroads: The concerns raid about this junction need to be supported with hard facts. So, if you are aware of any road use incident happening at this junction, please let the Parish Clerk (Heidi Frary) or Parish Chair (Michael Hill) have all the details (with photos if possible) which would support representations to NCC.

Top Row Phonebox: An accident at the junction resulted in the total demolition, and subsequent removal, of the BT Phonebox. Some parishioners told the Parish Council that they want to organise for its reinstatement. If you support this idea and would like to help please tell the Parish Clerk and she will pass your contact details on.

Library visit: A Norfolk Mobile Library visits Wreningham once a month (see our website for details) and parks in two places in Top Row. The Norfolk Library Service advises that it possible for the stop at the Village Hall (or thereabouts) to be reinstated if there is sufficient interest.
