

MESSAGE FROM CHAIRMAN

'Summer is finally upon us, but despite a dry St Swithens' day, the weather mix is typically British!!

In that regard, the VH committee has for some time been wrestling with issues concerning excessive condensation in the Hall and the on-going maintenance of our Village Social Centre and keeping it weather-proof. The upshot is that we are going to have to install a new roof (the current one was installed 19 years ago and is nearing the end of its recommended life span!) at a cost of approximately £37,000 and we need to raise funds to ensure we remain financially viable. We are considering a number of options, including grant applications and seeing if there is enough support for another village lottery like the Diamond Jubilee one for the Church window.

However, this is also a direct appeal to all householders in our community by way of a request for any charitable financial donations which you may be willing to make to help maintain the excellent facility that we have in our village. We are a registered charity and any such donation is eligible for gift-aid, which would be a considerable boost to our efforts. We, as trustees, recognise that it is a difficult time financially for us all and we do not have the traditional appeal of a church roof or spire, but our Village Hall plays a highly important role in community life, whether as the vibrant social centre with all the activities organised by the busy Social Club or as a venue for all types of other events in the Hall, including its use by our school.

So, please consider what you may be able to do for your Village Hall, as well as what your Hall can and does do and offer for you and give as generously as you can. All donations should be to our Treasurer, Christine Minns, and any cheques should be made to the Wreningham Village Hall.

The Council congratulates Heidi Frary for being awarded the title of "Norfolk clerk of the year for small parish councils". Well done Heidi!



Events are being held across the country to commemorate the day in 1914 when Britain went to war. The membership had grown to 29 at the end of the first season in April 1985. With loans, fund-raising and a generous donation from Henry Curling 2 bowling mats and equipment were purchased. Henry Curl was made the first President.

The Club joined the English Short Mat Bowls Association (E.S.M.B.A.) and were the founder members in East Anglia. In due time the club joined the South Norfolk Short Mat Bowls League (S.N.S.M.B.) in which we still play. We also play within the club for the Singles and Doubles titles. This year the club finished a very respectable 4th in the league.

Over the past 28 years there has been an ebb and flow of members and at present we are very keen for new members, young and old to join us. It has always been a very friendly and sociable club making new members very welcome.

Once again Wreningham church is taking this opportunity to help local people who may be struggling to feed themselves and their family for whatever reason, by supporting the Norwich Foodbank.

The Norwich Foodbank gives 3 days of emergency food to individuals and families in crisis. Local care professionals in the Norwich area refer people to them using a food voucher which is exchanged for food supplies. In rural areas they have Emergency Food Boxes or give boxes direct to local care-workers. They also support local agencies working with distressed and destitute people.

We invite everybody, whether you attend church or not, to join us in this collection. Please leave your contribution at the church during the day on Thursday 18th or Friday 19th September. Or if you are coming to a Harvest Festival service do bring your contribution with you.




