At the time of writing the planning application for the 10 house development on Church Road (2015/2449) is about to be considered for approval. The developer expects to start work in late Spring and complete the following year. You are aware of the three new houses adjacent to the Bird in Hand. They are likely to be occupied in the coming months, as new families move in. I am sure that you will welcome them and ensure they become involved in the village.

The Parish Council has discussed reports of an increasing problem of careless and dangerous driving on all the roads in the village, especially at school run time. The culprits are less likely to be villagers but if you know anyone who tends to drive aggressively or without due care please remind them that misusing our narrow roads places all road users at risk. Otherwise our PCSO, Darrin Sore, is interested in talking to them more formally.


