The Church Road development is well under way. The planning application and subsequent public consultations and parish meetings covered many issues and the documents and planning officer's report are still available on the SNC website. I have spoken to the site manager and he is happy to meet anyone who wishes to talk about the development.

Particular concerns are: the hedgerow - it has been removed, but will be replaced by a mixed native species sited back from the road edge behind a trod fronting the length of the site; drainage - a significant drainage ditch has been created along the back of the site (all surface water will drain into it) the water will run West and join an exisiting Northerly ditch towards Hethel Road. No surface water will run East from the site.

Landowners ask dog walkers to "scoop that poop" since the mower blades scatter the deposits all over - not pleasant if you are in the way!

Following a tree inspection and review for the playing field, the Village Hall site and the Reading Room, we are arranging for tree surgeons to make safe a number of failing/dead trees and to trim others. This is expected to happen in October.

We are working with Travis Perkins to explore the options for new road signage to improve the safety of the Mill Lane/B1113 junction. More on this in due course.

Our next meeting is on 15th November, usual time and place. As ever, meeting agenda and minutes are posted on the website. You are welcome to attend.



Norfolk - united against abuse

In Norfolk 2,709 safeguarding adult concerns were raised from April 2015 to March 2016 (over 100,000 cases in England each year). We probably know someone who needs help with their money, to pay their bills or for shopping, or support to get around or carry out daily tasks. Often there is a formal or informal arrangement in place with Social Services, a care home, carer, friend or relative. Sometimes, though, things may go wrong. The person needing support may feel uncomfortable, afraid or hurt in the situation, or find their money or possessions are being taken from them.

Adult abuse has many forms: physical, emotional, sexual, financial abuse (money or belongings are taken without permission). Neglect is another - when those who are there to help do not do it properly, or, a person may neglect themselves to an extent which puts them at risk. The abuser may be a stranger, but sadly it is often someone they know, in a position of trust and power, such as a health or care professional, a family member or neighbour.

Everyone has a right to feel safe, to make their own decisions, to be respected and listened to, and live free from abuse or neglect.

Look out for the signs of abuse. These can include someone who looks dirty, is not dressed properly or has an unexplained injury. Other signs can include someone who seems frightened around certain people, seems unusually down or withdrawn or who finds money missing.

Trust your instinct – if something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Even if you're not sure, report it to Norfolk Social Services, anonymously if you wish, with as much information as possible to help follow up.
