- * Guidelines for Recreation Provision in new residential Developments. South Norfolk are asking about the requirement for recreational provision for new builds and about handing over management responsibility either to local parish councils or to a private organisation.

This is a full time post and she will be responsible for the 8 churches and 4 church schools within the Upper Tas Valley Benefice. We are expecting her to be licensed sometime in September.

I would like to thank all those who helped to decorate the church for Easter. The flowers received many comments, not least from Revd. Foster, the clergy on Easter Day, and they lasted for several weeks.

Once again the quiz run jointly with Ashwellthorpe church was a good, social evening supported by 14 teams. We raised £443 to be split between the two Fabric Funds. Our next joint fund raising event will be an "Afternoon Cream Tea" at the home of David Turner, Woodman's Lodge, The Street, Ashwellthorpe on Wednesday 20th June, 2.30 – 4 pm. We are grateful to South Norfolk Council and Wreningham Parish Council for the grants towards the cost of this new board. An inspection has been carried out and we are now waiting for quotes to repair the East wall.

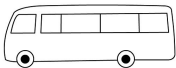

The May order of some 9000 litres was placed with a good price and delivered in early May.

If you use oil for heating, do contact him about you needs and any specific delivery requirements you may have (e.g. limited access for vehicle, urgently required, etc.). Note: the supplier will bill you direct; John does not handle the money.

If you have friends or neighbours that you know use heating oil, please pass on his contact details so he can include as many in the scheme as possible, and thereby be in a better position to negotiate a lower price for everyone.

p.s. If either bank is full, please call the number on the side to get it replaced with an empty one.

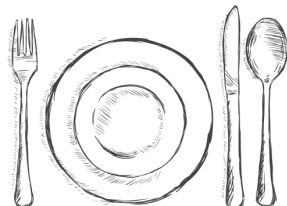
