

The Junewsparent brochul Farm -The July meeting of the WHG was well attended. We viewed newspaper cuttings describing long forgotten village events from the early part of the 20th century, plus a farm auction brochure and fascinating details of a pedigree stallion at Hill Farm - both of a similar vintage. The original documents all belong to a long established Wreningham family.

We were then treated to a tape recording (painstakingly upgraded and transferred to modern media by one of our members) of a 1989 Radio Norfolk interview of a Wreningham resident - and learnt that some aspects of village life have not changed a bit!

Plans for the autumn history event at the school are going ahead; we hope to have a date, shortly. We're inviting people who went to Wreningham School to attend. We hope this will be beneficial to our current pupils' understanding of the history of their school as well as being of interest to the village generally. I have grown to specialise in large mammals: stags, horses, giraffes, pigs, wild boar, a rhino and a unicorn. I have work at Africa Alive, Banham Zoo, Strattons Hotel in Swaffham and Jeavons Wood Primary School in Camborne, Cambridgeshire (now known as the Stag School due to my sculpture) as well as public venues in Scotland and private collections around the country.

Having grown up in Wreningham, I returned in 2009 and was lucky to be able to set up my studio right where I started welding in 1995.



The Lifeboat Horse was made for the Wells Maltings Heritage Arts Trail in 2018. When he was removed for the winter the Harbour Master, Robert Smith, initiated a successful fundraising appeal to buy him for the town. He was put back on the edge of the marsh in May and is partially submerged everyday by the ebb and the flow of the tide: a memorial to the work of the lifeboats and to the horses that pulled them.

Recycling News Update



Great News! Thank you to everyone who has dropped off their biscuit, cake bar, crisp, snack and pet-food packaging. I have iust sent off my 6th pet-food box and my first snack and biscuit boxes to TerraCycle. Please keep dropping your plastic off and, if in doubt whether it's right or not, just let me have it and I'll sort it out. Check out the accompanying flyer for further information.

However, can I mention a couple of things? On the reverse of the flyer it mentions the plastics that can go to a company in Rackheath. Sadly, the company no longer takes the public's plastic but please, continue to drop it off. Alternatively, you can take it to the main supermarkets and put it in the plastic bag recycling. Please note, this must be stretchy plastic such as bread bags, toilet roll bags, bubble wrap and carrier bags. If the plastic is noisy when crunched and doesn't stretch (such as that covering supermarket bakery goods or greetings cards or inner bags of cereal packets) they can't be recycled and will have to go in your black bin. Check out the full list on the flyer.

You've all been very good at dropping off hard plastic too and the first shipment went to Mildenhall Household Recycling Centre as I passed it on my way to Eurodisney!

Please keep it up. The more we collect, the more we can keep out of landfill, the countryside and the seas. And obviously the more we send off to TerraCycle, the more we are raising for PACT.
