Many in the village are taking precautions regarding the coronavirus pandemic. Covid-19 is not ordinary flu, but something much more serious and very easily caught. We all know the reality of Covid-19 and how quickly the situation can change. There are simple actions we can take to reduce the risk to ourselves and to others.

Within the village we are working to ease the situation for those who are "self-isolating" because of their age, underlying health issues or as a result of experiencing flu-like symptoms. The village website carries links to useful sites which provide information for the public. This Mardle provides some basic information to remind people about the simple steps to protect themselves and those they may come into contact with. Several villagers are already keeping an eye on friends, family and neighbours. Volunteers have identified themselves as being ready to help as and when requested. What is being created is a community response to help villagers as needed. However this is not a replacement for the emergency services. Several volunteers can only offer telephone or email support, as they themselves fall into the at-risk category.

The 10<sup>th</sup> March meeting of the Parish Council may be the last one for a while; keep an eye on the website or noticeboards for information about the next meeting. Jon Moon has resigned as a Councillor due to pressure of work. Thank you Jon for volunteering your time and energy to the community. We are sorry to see Jon leave but, looking forward to our next meeting where we hope to see new Councillors come forward to fill our two vacancies.

# **Coronavirus (Covid-19)**

You will be aware that Covid-19 is spreading steadily throughout the world. There have been a number of infections on the Continent and a few in this country. As yet, there are no reported cases in South Norfolk. However, as we well know the situation could change very quickly.

This leaflet is designed to provide basic information and some practical tips.

#### **Symptoms**

The symptoms are flu-like and can range from very mild to quite serious. After an incubation period of two weeks, an infectious period will exist whilst the flu-like symptoms are apparent. For 99% of all those infected, the infection will pass and you will get better.

#### **Precautions**

- Good hand hygiene keep your hands and lower arms clean. Washing hands properly is a 20 second task – you need to ensure that every part of your skin is well cleaned. Soap and warm water is best for this. Use sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available.
- Wash hands frequently.
- Avoid touching your nose, mouth, and eyes this
  is how the virus gains access to your body.
- Avoid touching any surface which others may have touched.

#### Reporting

If you believe you have the symptoms **DIAL 111**, they will take you through a protocol designed to identify infected individuals. They will advise on any testing necessary.

#### DO NOT call 999.

DO NOT visit your surgery – if you need medical support for this or other conditions, contact your surgery through your normal contact approaches (phone, e-mail, etc.)

#### **Confirmation of Infection**

If you are found to be infected, the medical staff will advise what you need to do next.

Family, friends and neighbours may be willing to help by running errands (for food, medicines, etc.) but do not invite them in – ask them to leave anything on the doorstep.

#### Other information

Public Health England websites<sup>1</sup> carry a significant amount of advice, guidance and current information. If you have no access to a computer, ask a friend or neighbour to help.

#### **Wreningham Covid-19 Community Support**

A recent e-mail survey identified residents who are volunteering to respond to calls for assistance. These calls may be for a chat (by phone, e-mail or social media), to collect medication, to obtain a few items from a shop, to post cards, etc. A more urgent request may be referred to the emergency services.

Note we, and you, would not expect a volunteer to expose themselves to increased risk from infection. Hence any personal visit will be undertaken with suitable precautions. For example volunteers will leave items collected for you on your doorstep.

In a short time a volunteer will be delivering cards in your street. These will introduce the contact(s) for your street and provide telephone and email details. Please use this to let them know what assistance you may need and when. They will get in touch with you.

We hope to issue cards which can be placed in a window to attract attention from passers-by. Volunteers will keep an eye out for these and get someone to contact you.
