Bonfires

The bonfire season is with us again and we are already receiving bonfire complaints. For the best effect, complaints should be addressed to the Environmental Officer at South Norfolk; he/she will expect evidence of repeat and serious offending – so keep a log and perhaps pictures of the offending bonfire or smoke plume.

If you do opt for a bonfire, please remember your neighbours. Burning greenwood can create a significant amount of smoke and pollution; wait a week or two to allow it to dry out. Minimise the amount of irritation you may cause by being careful what you burn and when you burn it. Choose a suitable time and day and watch the wind direction.

Whilst you are tidying up your gardens, consider how much of your hedges, trees and brambles intrude into the roadside – is it time to trim these back? They can be very painful for cyclists and walkers.

Jubilee

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee is from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June 2022. At the last Jubilee in 2012, a Parish Event was organised along Mill Lane and in the playing field. If you think we should join in with the national planned events and have one of our own and you would like to be involved, please contact the Clerk with your proposals and offer as a volunteer. We can then assemble a planning team to plan the event.

Village Litter Pick

Cllr. Keith Morris is organising the Parish Litter pick this year. The Village Hall will be the hub from which we venture forth to tidy up our roads, and eventually return for refreshments. More details will be posted on the village website and perhaps in this edition of the Mardle too.

Flooding

The Parish Council recently commissioned a survey of the surface water drainage system at the Loke in Wymondham Road. This has confirmed that the drain is blocked for approximately 11m and may have collapsed. This problem is not going to go away and has in the past contributed to flooding in and along Wymondham Road. For a number of years Trevor Wadlow has been central in pushing for a solution — this may well require the concerted effort from residents on Wymondham Road. We will work with Trevor and other interested parties to explore solutions.

For walkers, please note that a boardwalk bridge on footpath three (top end of Long's Wood) is to be repaired by NCC. Details (with map) have been posted on the website in the events calendar.

Defibrillator (AED)

You are probably aware there is a defibrillator located outside the kitchen door at the village hall (facing the car park). This is a life-saving piece of equipment which is available for anyone, resident or public, to use and, whilst some of you may be familiar with its operation, many of you won't be. For anyone interested in finding out more, please visit https://www.wreningham.org.uk/defibrillator-aed-at-the-village-hall/. This provides the minimum necessary information about its operation. Should you want to know more or receive training, get in touch with the Clerk.

Wreningham Fuel Trust

The Trust Deed sets out that "The income from Wreningham Fuel Trust has to be given to provide fuel for the poor persons of the parish of Wreningham". This means that the charity income is available to anybody living in the parish who is in need and the application may be made by the needy person or anybody who wishes to nominate a person to receive help towards their fuel bills. The Trust does have a regular income, mainly from interest on money on deposit. Anybody wanting help can apply at any time of the year and the Trustees will consider each application, in confidence.

Traditionally, when we have few applicants, the Trust invites our elder parishioners to apply to the fund for consideration for a distribution to take place in January. Recycling News

Thanks to your donations, our total raised so far is over £400 which is absolutely fantastic and represents over 75,000 pieces of plastic saved from landfill. Well done everyone!

Today I was also able to pass on to Hallswood Animal Sanctuary bags of confectionery, bread bags, toothpaste tubes and brushes and a bag of laundry/dishwasher outer packaging. I also have bags of contact lenses to take to Cecil Amey in Wymondham and 4 large bags of tablet blister packs. If anyone is going into Norwich, is it possible you could take them to Superdrug in St Stephens for me?

Whilst we go onwards and upwards, I have some news that will be disappointing to you. Mars Petcare, who sponsor the pet food packaging with TerraCycle have withdrawn their sponsorship. This means that we will no longer be able to collect all those cat food pouches, doggy treat bags and wild bird food sacks. If you can get your packaging to me by **Monday 8**th **November**, I'll be able to get it into the last consignment but after that I can't process them. HOWEVER, all is not lost.

Tesco, Sainsburys and the Co-op have expanded the plastics they take for recycling and that includes pet food pouches. To date, I know that Tesco Harford Bridge and Sainsburys Longwater take them, I don't know about Mulbarton Co-op but will find out.

In addition to pet food pouches, many of the supermarkets will now take biscuit wrappers, crisp packets, confectionery packaging, cheese wrappers, coffee bags, baby food pouches, household laundry and dishwashing tablet pouches etc – all those are things we send off to raise vital funds for charity – so <u>please</u>, <u>please</u>, <u>please</u> continue to give them to me, DON'T take them to the supermarket. Not only do the charities lose revenue but we really don't know how they are processed.

It's so difficult to keep up to speed on things recycling. It seems as soon as I say something, it's changed but we can only do what we can do. At least most changes are for the good.

Don't forget there is a Facebook group – Eco living in and around Wreningham – if you're on Facebook, please join. There's lots of useful information, support from other members and stuff from all over the World.

As the Mardle only comes out every 2 months, it's hard to share urgent information. However, I will try to make sure you don't miss out.
