#### **DONATIONS FOR UKRAINE**

On Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Ian Macrae saw a programme on tv that would affect many local people and ultimately help people



desperate for help many miles away. He saw an appeal to help the people devastated by the invasion of Ukraine. Within hours of deciding he wanted to do something about it, the publicity machine kicked into action, appeals went out on the various Wreningham Facebook groups and pages and other local social media. Ian never expected the response that he received.

The Village Hall agreed to be the receiving point on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> with a 4 hour slot for drop off. Within an hour, the Council Room was full and Spratts kindly offered their office space so all clothing a bedding were taken there leaving the toiletries at the hall. 2 hours later, a halt had to be called as both spaces were full. Unfortunately, some people had to be turned away, the response had been so great.

All toiletries were taken by Coleman Removals of Diss for sorting and forwarding. The clothing and bedding were taken to Grady's barn at The Poplars by Hughie Glaves and Roddy Goldsmith and an army of residents spent days sorting and boxing items which were then taken to Norfolk Polonia for onward transport to Poland.

It was a true village exercise and thanks are given to everyone involved from donors, through storers and sorters to transportation.

However, the main thanks must go to Ian and Margaret Macrae without whom this would never have happened.

Everyone now deserves a well-earned rest.

#### **Recycling News**

Great News! The total we have raised has now passed £600 which is amazing and thankyou to everyone. This apparently equates to 118,650 items not in landfill; an incredible figure. I'll make my next donation to PACT in June when I hope we'll have reached £700.

As you know, the pet food programme has now closed (as has the baby food programme) so it's even more important to save everything that can raise money from its recycling. I know the supermarkets will now take crisp packets, confectionery and biscuit wrappers but please, please don't take them there, bring them to our village dropoff in Wymondham Rd. Charities need the funding more than ever and recycling through supermarkets takes money away from organisations that need it.

You all know about crisps, confectionery and biscuit wrappers but can I please stress we take cheese wrappers, dishwasher and laundry pod bags, dishwasher salt bags and packaging from home cleaning wipes too. Every programme is sponsored by a company and they dictate what is acceptable, it's not me. TerraCycle tells me the minimum weight required to qualify for money & I need to achieve those minimum weights. So, the more I get, the closer to that weight I move.

Just a thought - my experience of care homes is that they use a lot of the items we collect – crisps, biscuits, cheese, blister packs so if anyone works in or visits care homes, please ask if you can have them or put me in touch with the manager. Similarly, if you're back at work, can you set up a collection point? Or speak to your local pub. There is loads of plastic just being thrown away and we want it!


