Back in March, we received some amazing news that our application to the National Lottery Community Fund for a grant had been accepted. We have been given £15,000 to fully modernise our Village Hall kitchens. Lots of hard work went into the application, it really will make a difference to our plans for the hall going forward.



A huge thank you to everyone involved.

The work will start after the Community Weekend which is on Saturday 15th & Sunday 16th June. On the Saturday, there is the School Fete & Colour Run & on the Sunday over a dozen villagers are very kindly opening their gardens for the Open Gardens event.

Fish & Chips nights are well supported, however, we would appreciate having a few more volunteers to help with the 5:15pm and the later 7:15pm collections from Mulbarton.

It has now been a year since we started to offer villagers a digital copy of the Mardle and weekly email updates. Over 50 households have now chosen to receive their copy of the Mardle via email.

These households prefer getting their copy this way, so we are simply satisfying their individual needs. It does, of course, have an additional environmental benefit of reduced paper and printing costs. It also puts less strain on the people who very kindly spend time organising & delivering nearly 250 copies.

We are aware that there are concerns that the Mardle will at some stage become a digital only newsletter. Please rest assured that we have NO intention of stopping the paper copies.

I hope this clears up any misunderstandings.



Friends of Wreningham School

The village school was built in 1850s with an extension added in 1901 which is now our school hall. It has managed to retain many of its original features, but sadly we have 15 windows which need to be replaced as they are rotten and beyond any further maintenance. The FOWS are therefore currently fundraising to raise £10,400 to replace these windows. We're overwhelmed by the donations we have already received from the Parish Council, Village Hall, school families & local residents. We cannot thank you enough for your support.

We have 2 major events in June:

Friday 7th June - 80s night -7:30pm -10:30pm Wreningham Village Hall

The Wreningham Village Hall is hosting a fundraising event for the school's window replacement project. The event is open to all ages, with tickets priced at £5 for adults and £3 for children available at the door.

Saturday 15th June - Summer Fete 10:30am - 3pm Wreningham Primary School

We will have traditional games for all the family to enjoy, BBQ and refreshments (hot & cold drinks, ice lollies, sweets, cakes and a small selection of alcoholic beverages), raffle, stalls, guinea pig enclosure and a bouncy castle.



For the very first time we will be holding a Colour Run on Wreningham playing field on the same day as our fete.

To ensure the safety of all children, this event will have 4 timed waves:



11:45am-12:15pm Wave 1 Pre schoolers 12:30pm - 1:00pm Wave 2 KS1

1:15pm - 1:45pm Wave 3 KS2

2:00pm - 2:30pm Wave 4 - All other children and adults running without children

All participants will need to wear goggles or sunglasses and a white t-shirt. After running a maximum of 2 laps of the playing field and being squirted with washable paint all participants will receive a certificate and wristband.

Tickets are priced at £5 and need to be purchased in advance of the event.
